

The Third Sunday of Advent Sunday, December 13th 2020



Dear Friends,

As you will be aware, I have been giving the pattern of our Christmas Services this year serious thought in recent weeks, and have consulted carefully with the lay officers of our parish. I knew that whatever we do offer needed to take into account a number of very significant factors, which would not normally frame our service patterns. Among these are the prohibition on any congregational singing of hymns and carols, a limit on the numbers attending any one service to ensure we can worship in our church with safe physical distancing, and also the consideration of those who continue to shield at home because of their vulnerability to the coronavirus. You will see below the pattern we have created is a mix of physical and online services.

Given the physical limitations that we must work with, and the safe limit on numbers, I have decided to offer a Service of Christmas Carols and Readings which will be exactly the same on the three consecutive evenings in the week running up to Christmas. This will give opportunity for over 200 people to attend a traditional Christmas Service in the beauty of St Margaret's Church. I realise we will feel the absence of our ability to sing Christmas Carols together acutely but that is a sacrifice we are being asked to make for our mutual well-being at this time. I would suggest that if you do feel strongly about singing carols then the sensible option is to access one of our two online services, on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, which will include traditional Christmas Carols which you can indeed sing in the safety of your home!

Our Crib Service, which often has an attendance of over 500 people, will be online this year. I felt that for everyone's safety this was by far the best option in our present circumstances. I feel any other option is likely to either exclude a large number of people or create confusion and possible difficulties of having to exclude large numbers of people on the church door on Christmas Eve. Either way, I felt the outcome could be, at best, unfortunate and it will be best for the many families who would normally come to worship to do this year in the security and comfort of their homes. Obviously, they can, if they wish, access one of the other five Christmas Services across the week.

In order to give access to physical worship to as large a number of people of possible, we are guaranteeing that you can come to one of our five acts of worship during the week. Hopefully, this will be your preferred option, but if you give Vickie two then we shall fit you into one or the other. If you would like to come to a second service also, then we will endeavour to accommodate you, but cannot guarantee it until we know the level of demand. Please be patient with Vickie as she works out the practicalities of this. It is very likely she could be dealing with over 250 requests next week and it will take some time to work things out and try and accommodate everyone's desires. Our times are indeed, exceptional, and they do create exceptional demands for us as a church, one which works with one part-time office staff member and volunteer helpers. They do very remarkable things on a shoestring!

How to book a Christmas service

The programme of Christmas services in church has now been published. You will be guaranteed attendance at one of the five services over the week running up to Christmas Day, and also offered the chance to be on a "waiting list" for a second service, should you wish to attend more than one. The service on Sunday 20th, Monday 21st and Tuesday 22nd at 6.30pm is exactly the same service, being offered on three consecutive evenings to provide the opportunity for as many as people to attend church as possible in a safe and socially distanced manner. As we can only host 70 people at each service you will not be able to attend the service if you have not made a booking.

Please request your first choice and second choice service by emailing Vickie at stmargaretschurchpa@gmail.com. Please give your name and the names of each individual you wish to attend with you and include a contact phone number for each adult even if you have provided them on other occasions!

Christmas Appeal for Keighley Women's Refuge & Staying Put

This year's Christmas appeal is in aid of the women's refuge in Keighley which is run by the charity *Staying Put*.

Staying Put is a domestic and sexual abuse charity working with women, men and children who are victims, with survivors and with families with complex needs across West and South Yorkshire, and with perpetrators in challenging their behaviour and actions. By offering both practical and emotional support it's often possible for clients to remain safely in their own home, allowing them to stay within their community and support networks. However, for the

20% of clients who are at high risk, remaining in their homes is not an option and secure temporary refuge or dispersed accommodation is provided.

Staying Put say, "Domestic and sexual abuse can affect anyone at any stage in their life. In 2020 during the COVID-19 pandemic we have seen domestic abuse incidents rise dramatically due to the lockdown and the "stay home, save lives" message, resulting in an escalating risk to vulnerable people. Recently the referral rate for our services has gone through the roof. Since the lockdown measures were put into place in March, we have seen approximately 200 more referrals to our services per month than this time last year. Our work is needed now more than ever."

This link has been developed in conjunction with the St Margaret's branch of the Mothers' Union. All donations given at the Christmas services will be passed to *Staying Put*. Last year £4,800 was raised. This year's financial appeal is particularly important as, due to COVID restrictions, we will not be able to provide our usual assistance in kind through toiletries and gifts.

Contributions (cash or cheque made payable to St Margaret's PCC) should be put in an envelope marked for the attention of the Stewardship Secretary and placed in the safe at the back of church. If you wish to Gift Aid, please state this in your email or in a covering note and we will use your existing GA declaration or send a form out to you.
