

The Second Sunday Before Advent Sunday, November 15th 2020



Dear Friends,

"It is dark, no moon, no light Just darkness, a starless sky The wind blows, the waves break A single firefly passes by

Soon the firefly is gone Leaving me in the darkest of nights. The tiny fly made me anticipate A sunrise with the finest of lights."

This poem was posted by Aufie Zophy on his website in July. A number of you have commented to me that you were very taken by the image given to us by our new Archbishop, which I shared in this letter a couple of weeks ago, that the Christian hope is not to be seen as a light at the end of the tunnel, but rather that it is a light with us amidst our present darkness.

This poem anticipates hope in the shape of the creation itself – the tiny fly experienced as a foreshadowing of the new day to come. This hope is given, known and experienced within the creation itself.

For all of us the hope of a vaccine to immunise us from the effects of the coronavirus is a tangible and real sign of hope. One which will release many of us from our present confinements, leading us back to freedom and the fullness of life. I am not a scientist, nor an immunologist. However, as a theologian what I do see in this news of hope of a vaccine, is the way in which God enables us to respond to the present sufferings that we experience. God has made us co-creators with him, and within that creation he has given us the resources and ingenuity to

overcome the distortions and diseases which are also part of our world. This goes to the heart of the liberation and freedom which we have been given as human beings, endowed with the ability to imagine and originate from the very substances given to us in creation a cure for our diseases. This goes to the heart, too, of the actions and messages of Jesus of Nazareth who came to heal the sick, give liberty to the captives, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour. The hope of a road out of our present plight is the very incarnation of the faith that we have because we believe that God is with us. I would boldly say that we must let no humanist or secularist provide any other narrative to this where God is set up as the scapegoat for all the ills of our present plight or has simply abandoned to us our fate. These are potentially hopeless narratives of despair and nihilism.

In my letter two weeks ago I drew the parallel between Archbishop Stephen's analogy and our liturgical experience of Easter Eve, carrying the newly lit Paschal Candle into the complete darkness of a waiting church. The Easter Exultet which is sung after that first light has been spread among us all tells the story of the freedom God brought to his ancient people the Jews at the Passover, and the new Passover of Christ in the resurrection on Easter morning. One of the hymns I have chosen for our YouTube Premiere Mass this Sunday ends similarly to that Exultet with these lines:

O'er lands both near and far Thick darkness broodeth yet Arise, O Morning Star, Arise and never set!"

As it says in the Second Letter of St Peter (1: 19) "You will do well to pay attention to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts."

Churchwardens are elected annually and may stand for six consecutive periods of office. PCC members and Deanery Synod representatives are elected for a period of three years.

The existing Deanery Synod members will continue in position until 31st December 2020. From 1st January 2021 the structure of the Deanery Synod will change, whereby we can have 5 members from St Margaret's. Those elected, automatically become members of the PCC.

The nomination forms for Churchwarden, PCC member; Deanery Synod are set out below in two different formats for you to choose from. *Please note that if you use the docx version, you will need to enter the name of the parish - St Margaret's, Ilkley - at the top of the printed form.*
