Dear Friends,

I am sure you will be aware that it has been announced by our government that we are to be in a "Tier 3" area when the present national lockdown ends next week. The good news contained in this change for us as a church, is that we can once again re-open our church building for public worship. However, it is important to remember that all of the restrictions and mitigations which we had to work with prior to this lockdown will remain in place as we return to Tier 3. Therefore, as well as all the measures we have in place to maintain "hands, face, space" we shall also need to continue to ask you to notify us of your intention to attend a service, effectively to manage numbers attending. Congregational singing of any kind will also remain prohibited. We do now have clarity regarding the near future and over the next few days I will have opportunity to create an appropriate pattern of Christmas services for 2020, both physically in church and on-line.

Our first physical act of worship in church, after the current lockdown, will therefore be on Sunday, December 6th at 10.00am. Please see the usual "poster" regarding services below.

On Thursday evening we held our annual church meetings on Zoom and elected a significant number of new members to our Parochial Church Council. This should give us all encouragement going forward. As is customary, I addressed the meeting about our life as a church, reflecting on where we are presently and inviting us to consider carefully our plans for the future. All of the boxes we receive will be distributed to people who need it most by a range of local organisations.



Suggested items:

Flour / Sugar / Rice / Couscous / Pulses / Tinned fruit and vegetables / Toilet Roll / Cereals / Instant Coffee / Tinned meat and fish / Dried Fruit & Nuts / Chocolate / Condiments / Long life milk & juice / Cooking Oil / Shampoo / Tea / Toothpaste & brushes / Deodorant / Sanitary products / Laundry detergent Please no porridge oats, pork or baked beans

TOP TIPS!

Please ensure each item has at least 3 months' shelf life, is in sealed packaging and can be stored at room temperature
Try to include a range of different size and weight items
2 smaller boxes may be better than 1 big one

 Please include 2 heavy duty bags-for-life in your box so the contents can be carried home on public transport

COVID-19 PRECAUTIONS

To try to minimise the risk of Covid-19:

- Boxes should be dropped off with our volunteers outside the church building
 Please do not bring your box if you

 We will guarantine the boxes for
- We will quarantine the boxes for 36-48hs before delivery
