A letter from the Patron and Bishop Toby

Dear Friends,

In preparation for the upcoming Annual Parochial Church Meeting, (APCM) on November 26th and Fr Philip leaving St Margaret's, we have been working with your Standing Committee and Parochial Church Council (PCC) to arrange a series of two meetings for all congregation members. These will be co-chaired by ourselves, the Bishop of Bradford and the Superior of the Community of the Resurrection, Mirfield, your Patron (with responsibilities in the process of selecting a new parish priest). They will provide an opportunity to learn about the selection process, to listen to one another as we share what we value and hope for at St Margaret's and to discuss, amongst other things, the particular question of female ministry. Please note that we are inviting people to attend both meetings, as the second will build on the first.

These meetings are scheduled for Tuesday, November 10th and Monday, November, 23rd both from 7:30pm until 9pm. In the context of current COVID restrictions, they will be held on Zoom. However, if you do not have the required technology for Zoom, you will be able to take part in the meeting by telephone. All the details of how to access the meetings are set out below.

St Margaret's is a church in the Anglican Catholic tradition and has traditionally had a male priest. However, a specific Resolution would need to be passed by the PCC if St Margaret's were to ask for only a male priest to be considered in the new appointment. We recognise that there are a number of people within the congregation who feel very strongly on this matter both for and against. We have decided, therefore, with the Standing

Committee, to provide an opportunity to discuss this issue before it is considered formally by the PCC. These meetings are for information and discussion and no decisions or votes will be taken.

The Church of England has ordained female priests for over 25 years, when, in 1994, 32 were ordained in Bristol Cathedral. The first female Bishops were ordained in 2015. Recognising that there are some who do not agree with these decisions, the Church of England has developed a protocol known as the *Five Guiding Principles* to enable it to work with this continuing difference of opinion. Booklets describing these Principles have been made available for study, and may be requested from the Vicar or members of the Standing Committee. It is against this background that these meetings have been arranged so that all those taking part in the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on November 26th can be fully informed and are able to make their own personal judgement.

We would like to encourage as many members of St Margaret's as possible to take part in both of these meetings. It will be helpful in the administration of the meetings for us to have some idea of the numbers who will be joining. Could we therefore ask that you contact Vickie, your parish administrator (preferably by email: <u>stmargaretschurchpa@gmail.com</u>) to let her know if you will be joining.

In advance of the first meeting, we encourage you to pray and think about what you value most about St Margaret's and what you hope for your church in the context of the wider parish.

Please note that as the meetings relate to the appointment of his replacement, Fr Philip will not be attending either of them.

We apologise for the length of this letter but hope that it clarifies the purpose and process for what will be two very important meetings. Please feel free to contact any member of the Standing Committee, (Helen Buswell, Alison Stretton, John McGhee, Steve Betts) if you need further information.

Nominations for all positions are open to anyone who is on the Electoral Roll of St Margaret's and who satisfies the other requirements specified on the nomination forms. Churchwardens are elected annually and may stand for six consecutive periods of office. PCC members and Deanery Synod representatives are elected for a period of three years.

The existing Deanery Synod members will continue in position until 31st December 2020. From 1st January 2021 the structure of the Deanery Synod will change, whereby we can have 5 members from St Margaret's. Those elected, automatically become members of the PCC.

The nomination forms for the three areas: Churchwarden; PCC member; Deanery Synod are set out below in two different formats for you to choose from. *Please note that if you use the docx version, you will need to enter the name of the parish - St Margaret's, Ilkley - at the top of the printed form.*

Alternatively, you can email the PCC Secretary at <u>catherinewebster7@gmail.com</u> with your name and address, stating which position you would like to apply for, confirming that you meet the legal requirements, and request that your proposer and seconder email me to confirm their support for your candidature, including their own name and address.There will be a meeting held immediately before the elections on that day where you will have a chance to hear from the candidates.

Remembrance Service Goes Online Sunday, November 8th

Ilkley Town Council has joined local radio station Rombalds Radio for a virtual Remembrance Service.

People can lay wreaths at the Cenotaph in the Memorial Gardens, in a socially distant manner, before or after Remembrance Sunday, but the town cannot gather to pay their respects in the usual way.

Fr Philip joined Ilkley's Town Council, District Councillors and Rombalds Radio to record an Act of Remembrance service which will be broadcast online at 3pm on Sunday, November 8th and will be freely available to view after the service. The 15 minute presentation includes the service of remembrance including a short talk, a reading, the laying of wreaths and other traditional elements.

Ilkley Town Mayor, Councillor Mark Stidworthy, said: "In this significant year marking 75 years since VE Day and VJ Day and the end of World War II, it is particularly important that we remember and honour all those men and women who have given their lives in the service of our freedom, either in that conflict, in those before or since, and as peacekeepers around the world. We also call to mind all those who have sustained life-changing injuries, the impact of loss on families in the Ilkley district, and the ongoing struggles of so many citizens, particularly veterans, in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic. I thank my District Councillor colleagues, Fr Gray, Ilkley's Town

Clerk and Rombalds Radio for coming together to create this short ceremony, which I hope residents will find a fitting and respectful tribute at this difficult time."

The Act of Remembrance will be broadcast at 3pm, Sunday November 8th on Ilkley Town Council, Ilkley Chat and Rombalds Radio Facebook pages. It will also be available on the Rombalds Radio <u>website</u> and YouTube channel.


