

THE EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY Sunday, October 11th 2020



Dear Friends

Last Sunday I was very privileged to baptise Thomas Frank Harrison. As you will imagine in our present circumstances, conducting a baptism was very different to our normal way of being. The "rule of six" for a baptism meant there were actually nine of us present with myself, Catherine our Verger, and Christopher our organist, who are allowed to be present as well, wholly physically distanced, as they are staff of the church who had roles in enabling the service to happen. It meant that the whole of St Margaret's Church, who would normally be present to welcome the new member of the Body Christ, were reduced to just three very scattered people in our church building. There were three godparents as well as Jack, Bethany and little Thomas. It is, of course, painful that Thomas' big brother or sister couldn't be present, nor his grandparents, his auntie, or any other members of his family. However, what we were able to celebrate was a uniquely intimate occasion, even with the required physical distancing.


Given a certain amount care and imagination we were able to celebrate much of fullness of the baptismal rites. We were able to maintain physical distancing by using our shell to baptise Thomas while Mummy held him. All of us shared in the act of christening prior to the baptism but instead of using our fingers we each had a cotton bud stick which we individually dipped in the oil of baptism before parents and godparents shared in the making the sign of the cross. Thomas was presented with his lighted baptismal candle immediately after the baptism, a sign

of the light of Christ amidst our present darkness. (Some hand sanitiser kept that safe as it was presented.) This was indeed a sign of the resurrection faith that we share as we all pass, immersed, through the depths of our COVID passion.

In my homily I spoke a little about the Christian hope. This is not just a blind optimism, nor is it a simplistic belief that all will be well in the end. Rather, the Christian hope is found in Christ himself who is our beginning and end – our Alpha and Omega. The Christian hope is found in our belief that Christ came to be with us, and is with us now, and will be with us until the end of time. He passed through the deep waters of death and holds out to us the hope of resurrection by being raised from the dead. The sign of the cross with which we christen baptismal candidates is the same cross which is made on our foreheads at some of the most other crucial points in life, and especially in our sickness and mortality. Here is Christ sharing with us and being with us in all things. Christ is with us so that there is no place or time when he is not present. There is no situation where he is not bearing and upholding us with the same arms of love which he held out to the world on the cross.

I pray that we may all reminded of, and rejoice in, our baptismal faith as we welcome little Thomas into the Body of Christ. I pray too that his new life be a sign to us all of the hope which is held out to us all in our Lord Jesus Christ.


