Dear Friends

We held a very positive and constructive meeting last Wednesday evening with Bishop Toby and Archdeacon Andy. Essentially this was a meeting of our Parochial Church Council but many more members of St Margaret's joined us as observers. Both Archdeacon Andy and Bishop Toby explained the processes that will take place in the coming weeks and months as St Margaret's moves to a time of vacancy and also begins the process of appointing her next Vicar. There was ample opportunity for all who attended to ask many questions about how those processes will work.

Organising this meeting, in our present situation, was especially complex and difficult. After much thought I decided the best way forward was for those leading the meeting to be in the Parish Hall, and for everyone else attending to be at home on Zoom to remove any possibility that our gathering could become a transmission point for the coronavirus. As we prepared for the meeting it also became apparent that far more people wanted to attend physically than we could safely accommodate in the Hall. Switching everyone to Zoom therefore enabled a much larger "attendance", though I am conscious that it excluded a smaller number of people who do not have such virtual on-line access. I suspect, as our pandemic continues to deepen, this will have to be our on-going model for meeting until the growing infection rates subside.

There is a large diversity of views on the question of the ordination of women to the priesthood across St Margaret's, and many took the opportunity to write in and share those views ahead of our meeting last Wednesday. This wasn't something that I invited but it happened spontaneously anyway. It is clear that, as a church, we will need to create a dedicated space to consider this question and its practical outworking for the future, as part of the appointment process for a new priest. At the meeting, therefore, Bishop Toby proposed that there might be two congregational meetings in the coming weeks chaired by himself, and a representative from our Patrons the Community of the Resurrection at Mirfield. There were also suggestions that we involve other clergy from outside the parish who might assist us with our theological and practical thinking on this matter. In the days to come we will advertise the dates for these meetings and eventually distribute the Zoom invitation. Obviously, this will be one of the points when I step back completely as I will not be involved in the process of framing the appointment of my successor.

Should you wish to be involved in this process and contribute to it, may I ask you to give a little time to reading this important document:



Until February 2021, Worth Connecting intends to support as many people as possible to get online.


If you, or someone you know, want to be able to use a digital device, we can help.

We can lend tablets and the means to access to the internet.


We have extensive teaching materials to help people understand popular digital activities both within a teaching session and when they are practising on their own.
