

# THE LAST SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY Sunday, October 25th 2020



### Dear Friends

It has been reported to me in the last 36 hours that a member of our congregation who attended Mass at 10.00am last Sunday has now received a positive test for the coronavirus. This person began to feel unwell in the middle of the week – though I am pleased to say that I could speak to them on the telephone today and whilst they feel a little unwell they were very positive. I am assured by them that they had no close or proximity contact with any one at church last Sunday, that they wore a face mask for the whole time they were at church, and followed all our normal COVID protocols. For the sake of clarity "close or proximity contact" is defined by national quidelines as:

- Face to face contact with an infected individual for any length of time, within 1 metre
- Proximity contacts extended close contact (within 1 to 2 metres for more than 15 minutes) with an infected individual
- Travelling in a small vehicle, like a car, with an infected person

Obviously, should anyone have had such contact we would have been in touch with them directly as a matter of urgency. As you will be aware, for some time now we have been surrounding our worship with enhanced mitigations against any potential spread of the coronavirus and we will continue to do so to ensure that our worship can continue in the safest

way possible in our unprecedented times. This does also reinforce to us all the necessity of all these mitigations and how important it is for all us that we respect them and one another in observing them in our behaviour when we gather. Above all else we pray that our friend makes a speedy recovery.

Should you be aware of anyone else receiving a positive coronavirus test who attended church last Sunday, or in the future, then please do contact me straight away and we will respond in accordance with national guidelines.

On November 1st and 2nd the Church celebrates All Saints' Day, followed by All Souls' Day. This year I intend that we shall celebrate All Saints' in Church on November 1st at the 10am Mass that Sunday.

Alongside this the YouTube Premiere Mass which we shall post on November 1st at 10.30am will be a celebration of All Souls' Day. A small number of the members of our choir gathered recently to record music appropriate for use in this Mass. It is traditional for us on All Souls' Day to pray for our dearly departed loved ones. Our usual means of gathering names, by writing them on a list at the back of church, is clearly not going to be possible this year. Therefore, can I ask you to send in names of the departed that you would like including in the YouTube Mass for All Souls' Day to Vickie at the Parish Office by end of Wednesday, October 28th? This will give us opportunity to collect the names together and to include them in the recording ahead of Sunday, November 1st.




