

HARVEST THANKSGIVING Sunday, October 4th 2020



Dear Friends

Over the coming weeks our focus will naturally be upon the processes for the appointment of my successor, and the care of our church and parish during the time of vacancy. Those of you who have been involved in the church for more than a few years may notice that the language has changed. The word "interregnum", which used to be used of the time "between vicars" has now been replaced by the word "vacancy". I believe the idea is that ministry does not stop — there is no interregnum — when the post of vicar is vacant. That is certainly a very important principle and one of my hopes and prayers is that in the coming time of vacancy the load of responsibilities in the parish can be shared by more people. In all voluntary organisations large parts of the work can easily fall to a small group of very willing volunteers. For St Margaret's to work well during the early parts of 2020 we will need more people to do a little more and share the load. Even if you are self-isolating or shielding I am sure there are very important contributions that you can make.

A key starting point has now been set for us. On Wednesday, October 14^{th,} Bishop Toby and Archdeacon Andy will be coming to join our PCC to talk about the appointment process and the vacancy. We will meet, physically distanced of course, in the Parish Hall in the evening. Should you wish to join us for that meeting then please do let me know. I would be very pleased for others to engage in this process, who are not presently on our Church Council, but obviously we will need to manage numbers attending. Just send me an e-mail, or telephone, and we should be able to include you.

On a different tack, it is hopefully worth my repeating a message which I have given in church as the colder autumnal weeks approach. As part of our planning to keep our church as COVID secure as possible we are leaving all the main windows in the church open to aid positive ventilation through the church. We are now going to change this slightly and we shall be closing the windows at the beginning of the weekend, whilst the church is closed, until we arrive on a Sunday morning for worship when they will be re-opened again. Clearly, we will be trying to keep a balance between retaining the heat we are putting into the church but also continuing with the necessary ventilation. Obviously, this has to be a compromise and it is very likely that the church will not be as warm as we are used to during the colder months of the year. Please therefore do bring some warmer clothes with you when you attend church if you are likely to feel the cold. This is another small price we shall need to pay to keep one another safe.

Harvest Reflection with your Family

An opportunity to reflect and be thankful for the food we eat.

You will need: an imported pineapple and a locally grown apple, along with a world map or a globe.

- Ask older children where they think the different fruits were grown and how far they have travelled. If your child is younger tell them first where the apple was grown, and then talk about the pineapple.
- Show them the different countries of origin on your map
- Talk about the farmers who grew the fruit, and the people who picked it. Mention that other people will have driven it to the packing station, and others will have packed it.
- More people will have transported the packed fruit (in the case of the pineapple, remember to think about the dockers and the sailors), and then people at the distribution centre will have sent it on its way to the shop or supermarket where you bought it.
- If you have a large sheet of paper, or a board, note down all the different people involved in growing the fruit.
- At the end, keep a few moments of silence to think about all the people who have worked hard to bring us the fruit and then thank God for their hard work.
- Finally, cut open both fruits and invite everyone to enjoy some.
