

DEDICATION FESTIVAL Sunday, September 6th 2020



Dear Friends

It was with both joy and sadness that we said "farewell" to Joseph and Charlotte Harrison last Sunday. Joseph is now being sponsored by our Diocese to train as a priest at the College of the Resurrection in Mirfield. His studies and spiritual formation will last a full three years before it is expected that he will be ordained first as a Deacon and then be appointed to serve as an assistant curate. They go with our love and prayers. There is great joy in seeing a young couple make the brave and committed step of offering their vocation to serve God's Church and people. St Margaret's has a long tradition of providing priests of the future as well as being a place of formation and training itself. However, we have seen Charlotte come to confirmation only eighteen months ago and both she and Joseph have made an important contribution to the life of our church. We will miss their presence and their friendship. I am sure, though, that we shall not lose touch with them.

This Sunday we shall celebrate our Dedication Festival. On September 10th 1879 our church was dedicated by the then Bishop of Ripon, Bishop Bickersteth. So this coming week St Margaret's Church will be 141 years old! Worship in our parish goes back a little earlier than that for there was a temporary "tin church" erected in 1874 once the land had been given by All Saints for the new parish in late 1873. Our present building was designed by the architect Norman Shaw, and whilst he did not build a great number of churches, I feel very privileged

that all three churches I have been Vicar of were designed by him: All Saints', Leek and St Matthew's, Meerbrook, both in Staffordshire. Shaw was able to express the profound spirit of Tractarianism through his church buildings, and we continue to rejoice in that inheritance today at St Margaret's. I love the fact recorded in our history that the first service in the "tin church" was a choral service of holy communion, the first ever seen in Wharfedale! Records show that the surpliced choir caused quite a stir!

At the Vicarage, Rebecca has returned to Durham to begin her third university year this week. We shall miss her huge help with all the on-line services! I am immensely grateful that Anthony is still able, though, around his many other commitments, to assist me in recording a weekly Mass from the temporary Chapel which we can premiere on YouTube for us all, and especially those who cannot come physically to church. The present maximum of forty for our physical service in church seems to be accommodating those who wish to come, but we will, of course, keep that under review as we move into the autumn. Our church is also now open each morning Monday – Thursday from around 9.30am – 11.30am for private prayer, and it has been good to see a small but steady number of people using that opportunity. I hope it continues to be an encouragement to us all as our present exceptional circumstances continue. We shall endeavour to adjust the patterns of our worship to our changing circumstances and proceed as safely and as boldly as we can.

You will see also that our monthly organ recitals are re-commencing this September in the notices below. This is a further encouraging step forward and I am very grateful to Christopher for enabling this to happen.


