

## THE SUNDAY NEXT BEFORE LENT Sunday, February 14<sup>th</sup> 2021



#### **Dear Friends**

Next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. It comes about halfway between Christmas and Easter. Normally we would attend a Mass in church and receive ashes marked on our foreheads in the form of a cross. These words are said at this point "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you will return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ."

So it is in between birth and death that we are to follow this injunction to turn away from sin. Lent swiftly follows Ash Wednesday and that gives us ample time in between Ash Wednesday and Easter to consider our sins and turn away from them.

Faced with that task, it might seem hard to find anything major which you could define as sinful. No major crimes, no serious moral lapses and so on. But sin is found in smaller things. So if you are stuck, consider the "seven deadly sins": pride, covetousness, lust, envy, gluttony, anger, sloth (laziness and apathy). Turn from them and be faithful to Christ. This is not easy at a time when our activities are limited but many are finding ways to communicate without breaking the rules. Do what you can and do not feel guilty about what you cannot do or be.

The transfiguration described in today's gospel tells of Christ's glory - just a glimpse, and then back down the mountain to reality. The disciples were now informed that the way for Jesus is not all glory, but that he was to suffer and die. His death was in between the Resurrection. The Resurrection is in between his Ascension into Heaven and his Second Coming.

So for us, we will suffer in many ways in this life and then at some point we shall die. Our death comes in between eternal life. As God's children, we inherit eternal life because "God so loved the world that he gave his only son that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have everlasting life."

#### Collect

Almighty Father, whose Son was revealed in majesty before he suffered death upon the cross: give us grace to perceive his glory, that we may be strengthened to suffer with him and be changed into his likeness, from glory to glory; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. #### First Reading 2 Corinthians 4. 3-6

Even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

#### **Second Reading** *Mark 9. 2-9*

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!' Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus. As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.
