Letter from Fr Bernard Moving Along

It is good to move another step along the road to normal as we welcome back the Family Service at 9.15am and the High Mass returns to its usual time of 10.45am on Sunday. This week, we also have Ascension Day on Thursday, May 13th, when there will be a Sung Mass at 11am. Please book your place with Vickie.

I have always looked on Ascension Day favourably because at our primary school, we had a service in church, and then the rest of the day off! I have memories of our mother meeting us for a trip to Ilkley on the bus from Bradford for a breath of fresh air on the moors and a cup of tea (and a bun) from the Ilkley Moor Tea Pavilion (see photo: it was demolished around 1965). Then back on the bus to the sooty, smoke filled air of Bradford. The Clean Air Act came in about 1970 – till then, it was a matter of "where there's smoke, there's brass!"

So then, why is Ascension Day so important?

- 1. It was the last time Jesus was seen on Earth.
- 2. However, it was a promise that he would be with us always in spirit until the very end of time.
- 3. He gave us a command, not a request, to preach the gospel.
- 4. The disciples were told to wait for the gift of the Father, to be baptised with the Holy Spirit.

When that happened (on Whit Sunday), they received that gift and became empowered to go into all the world. What they did not know was that all of them would be martyred within the next 40 years or so.

We in our parish are also waiting: for a new vicar. Let us pray for an outpouring on us of the Holy Spirit, to enable us to work and live with enthusiasm, dedication and sacrifice.

Perhaps we might start by giving generously to Christian Aid during Christian Aid Week. Details of how to donate are below.
