Letter from Fr Bernard

A few weeks ago we had a holiday by the seaside near Filey. I was reminded of the custom of buying a few sticks of rock to take home for family and friends.

I was always fascinated by the way the name of the resort, in bright red letters, ran through the whole stick of rock. Whichever way you consumed the rock, either by sucking it or chopping it up into pieces, the name lasted to the very end. It was constant throughout.

This reminded me of the fact that this is what God's love is for us - constant, whatever we do or don't do. There is a lovely reference to this in Bach's St John's Passion in one of the chorales which I remember singing as a chorister in the 1940s. We used to sing this great work on Passion Sunday, each year, in the cathedral in Bradford.

"Thy name is shining on me, Lord Jesu, day and night.
Thy cross alone hath won me. My inmost heart's delight.
For now, by faith depicted, the saving truth I see.
How thou, o most of afflicted hast shed thy blood for me."

If you want to sing it, the tune "All glory, laud and honour" fits. These words have been a comfort and strength to me through the years. The constant love of Jesus is always there. Whatever calamities, tragedies, desperations or joys we experience, his name still shines on us day and night. It does not fade through the years and will be with us to the end of our earthly life until we enter into that dwelling place which Jesus has prepared for us "so that where I am, there you may be also" (John 14 1-26).

Now read this hymn based on Psalm 23.

The Lord my pasture shall prepare,
and feed me with a shepherd's care;
His presence shall my wants supply,
and guard me with a watchful eye;
My noonday walks he shall attend,
and all my midnight hours defend.

Though in a bare and rugged way
through devious lonely wilds I stray,
thy bounty shall my pains beguile;
the barren wilderness shall smile
with sudden greens and herbage crowned,
and streams shall murmur all around.

When in the sultry glebe I faint,
or on the thirsty mountain pant,
to fertile vales and dewy meads
my weary wandering steps he leads,
where peaceful rivers, soft and slow,
amid the verdant landscape flow.

Though in the paths of death I tread,
with gloomy horrors overspread,
my steadfast heart shall fear no ill,
for thou, O Lord, art with me still:
thy friendly staff shall give me aid,
and guide me through the dreadful shade

Ilkley Lockdown Quilt Exhibition

When the first lockdown happened, Ilkley Manor House Trust felt it was important to capture some of the memories and experiences for the town as part of its social history.

It now has 126 quilt squares created by the community, including some made by members of St. Margaret's congregation. They have been made into eight quilt banners that will hang in the Manor House as part of the exhibition. The exhibition will also showcase other amazing groups who supported the town during the lockdowns.

As well as the quilts the Manor House received a grant from the Make:Film fund from Bradford Council. We used this to make a short film called 'Stories behind the Squares' and this will premier at the exhibition.
