ST MARGARET'S DAY
Celebrating our Patron Saint

Most churches when they are built, take the name of a Saint to be its Patron. We happen to know why St. Margaret was chosen to be ours.

The vicar of Ilkley, The Revd John Snowden, was the instigator expressing the need for a new church in Ilkley, as the parish church proved to be too small when the population grew and Ilkley attracted many visitors to the hydrotherapy offered at two large hotels.

He tackled the long and arduous process of creating a new parish - acquiring the land, and appointing an architect for the building - Norman Shaw. R.A. What an inspired choice that was.

It was in recognition of the vicar's tireless work that it was decided to choose St. Margaret as our Patron Saint. This was the name of his daughter, Miss Margaret Snowden, who actively worked on the process of creating this new church and parish.

Little is known of our Saint Margaret who lived in Northern Italy in the third century A.D. She resisted being persuaded to commit a sin which resulted in her martyrdom. Resistance to sin should be what we are about too.

When she is portrayed in art, she is shown conquering a dragon (evil). See the illustration above, taken from the middle window on the North side of the church. Here she holds our church nestling in her arms.

St Margaret's is open from 9.30am - 4.00pm daily for private prayer and reflection (except Sunday mornings) - you are welcome to visit church at a time that suits you.

We ask you to continue to observe covid safe practices when you enter church. Please use hand sanitizer when you enter and leave church and take responsibility for your own social distancing. Please also sign in on the sheet provided and pick up one of the "Please clean me" notices on entering church. We kindly ask you to leave this notice on your seat when you leave church.

The church will be kept as quiet a space as possible. However, please be aware that, as activity resumes a more normal pattern, our caretaker, Alan, may need to carry out cleaning or maintenance duties from time to time. Any social conversations should take place away from the Church and its grounds. There will be no hymn books or prayer books or other cards available, so if you would like any prayer resources please bring those with you and take them away similarly.

Choral Evensong, Sunday, July 18th and July 25th

Choral evensong will be held at 6.30pm on Sundays 18th and 25th July. There will then be the usual break over the summer and evensong will resume on Sunday, September 12th. There is no need to book but you will be asked to sign in on the day and sit in the nave. Please wear a mask, use the hand sanitiser provided and observe social distancing.

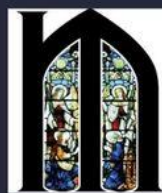
