Letter from Fr Bernard
St. Peter the Rock

Last Tuesday was St. Peter's Day. As he is the Patron Saint of York Minster, and our own Cathedral of Bradford, it seemed to be appropriate that I should write about St. Peter this week.

Peter was a strange man - impulsive, overenthusiastic. He denied his knowledge of Jesus three times on the night of the trial of Jesus.

In spite of this, Jesus could obviously see a potential in Peter, and was able to say to him, in Matthew 16 vs 18, "You are Peter." (his name means rock), "and on this rock I will build my church and the gates of hell will not overcome it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven." These keys are a symbol of Peter and they represent him on the coat of arms of our cathedral.

Peter the rock. Rocks are strong, solid, stable - our Cathedral is built from huge blocks of granite. The tower was built after the church was finished in 1508, and stands at 100ft high with walls 11ft thick in places. The strength of the tower was tested during the Civil War, when the royalists set out to destroy Bradford in 1642. Most people took shelter in the church and to protect the tower, bales of wool were hung from its pinnacles. The strong rock withstood the great cannon balls which were fired at it.

When the parish church became a cathedral in 1919 the coat of arms bore the keys of St Peter, a wool pack recounting the importance of wool in Bradford and the role the wool pack played in protecting the tower and the people.

Jesus saw beyond Peter's weaknesses to the strengths he needed for his future great task.

Sometimes we tend to see in ourselves only our foibles and failures. We need to realise that this is only a partial view of our whole selves. Jesus wants to reveal to us the other side, which he can see, and which he wants us to find, if only we will be still and silent and wait on Him.

A stunning collection of 50 wedding gowns and accessories is on exhibition in Ripon Cathedral until September 19th (extended date from 21 August) for visitors to come along and enjoy.

The exhibition will contain gowns, with their headdresses and veils, from 1885 to 2021. The collection will include a copy of the wedding gown worn by Katherine Worsley for her marriage to Edward, Duke of Kent, in York Minster in 1961 and a gown donated by Kleinfeld, New York - known for the TV programme 'Say Yes to the Dress'.

On July 29th, to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the wedding of HRH Prince Charles to the late Princess Diana, there will be two fashion shows featuring a copy of the dress and tiara worn by Diana.

The finale of the fashion show will contain copies of the gowns from the Royal Collection including those of the Duchess of Cambridge, Princess Margaret and Princess Anne along with exact copies of the tiaras worn at the weddings.
