

THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Letter from Fr Bernard The Girl Who Said "Yes"

The song of Mary in the Magnificat, must be the most sung or recited verses of scripture ever. The Magnificat is set in the Prayer Book for Evensong daily. In most cathedrals and college chapels it is sung daily set to music by composers from pre-Reformation times to the present day.

Here at St. Margaret's it is not said daily now, but in normal times, it is sung at our service of Choral Evensong every Sunday evening. It is a song of a young girl who said "yes" when the Angel Gabriel made the staggering proposition to her in Luke, 1 v 30. "Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favour with God. You will be with child and give birth to a son and you will give him the name Jesus". "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered, "May it be to me, as you have said." Then the angel left her, and Mary said, The Magnificat:

My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour. For he hath regarded the lowliness of his handmaiden. For behold, from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed. And his mercy is on them that fear him throughout all generations. He hath shewed strength with his arm. He hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. He hath put down the mighty from their seat and hath exalted the humble and meek. He hath filled the hungry with good things. And the rich he hath sent empty away. He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel as he promised to our forefathers Abraham, and his seed forever. Amen.

This canticle tells us much about God's nature. He regards the lowliness of Mary to accept a very uncertain future. In contrast, he scatters the proud. He puts down the mighty and exalts the humble and meek. He fills the hungry but sends the rich away empty.

In our own discipleship, we should be humble and meek, discerning the will of God for us however difficult or downright impossible it appears to be. We should say, "Be it unto me according to your word." Then we and others may find the blessing of God through us.

PS Choral Evensong is broadcast every Wednesday on radio 3 at 3:30pm and repeated on the following Sunday at 3.00pm. In term time, Choral Evensong takes place from a variety of cathedrals, and can be watched on YouTube.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death.

Easing of Covid Restrictions – Worship at St Margaret's

Please note that from Sunday, August 22nd, full seating will be reinstated in the nave.
