Letter from Fr Alex

Dear Friends

Natalie, the children, and I would like to thank you all for the wonderful welcome we have received since arriving in Ilkley about a month ago. We have already fallen in love with the church and the area, and we're sure we're going to be really happy here. It is a great privilege to serve you as your Vicar, and I'm so excited for all that lies ahead.

Sunday afternoon's installation was a tremendous celebration and the perfect way to begin our time with you. I know that so much work went into organising it all, and I would like to thank especially our wardens Alison and Helen, Vickie our administrator, our splendid musicians and servers, all who contributed to the flowers and the organisation of the welcome, and the wonderful refreshments arranged by Judith, and everyone who came and sent good wishes.

It was particularly good to have Bishop Nick with us, and to hear his affirmation in his homily of our liturgical and spiritual tradition. "The Church of England needs strong catholic parishes," he said. I pray that our rich contribution to the life of the Church will continue to go from strength to strength.

Sunday's service also gave me great hope as we continue to move out of pandemic restrictions, for all that we might be able to do together in person once more. As part of this, we will be reviewing our pattern of services as we look to worship together through the week, as well as on Sundays.

Pattern of service

I will pray morning and evening prayer at 7.45 am and 5.15 pm in church, Tuesday to Friday, and hope to reinstate some midweek masses before too long. I intend the morning and evening offices to be beautiful and spacious, with simple plainchant and time for contemplation. I do hope you'll consider joining me from time to time to begin and end the working day in prayer.

We will also reinstate the 8.00 am Holy Communion on Sundays from October.

If you have any comments or suggestions about our pattern of services – perhaps there is something new you'd like to see? Or something that you desperately miss since Covid stopped everything? – please feel free to call me or send me an email. My details are below.



Harvest Appeal for Mary's Meals Sunday, September 26th

This year, we celebrate Harvest on Sunday, September 26th, when our guest speaker will be Krzysia Condliffe from Mary's Meals.

Mary's Meals sets up community-run school feeding projects in some of the world's poorest communities, where poverty and hunger prevent children from gaining an education. One daily meal is provided in a place of learning to attract chronically poor children into the classroom, where they receive an education that can, in the future, be their ladder out of poverty. Community volunteers take turns to prepare, cook and serve the daily meal in each school, wherever possible using locally produced food.

Just £15.90 feeds a child for a whole school year.

There will be a retiring collection on the day. If possible, please use the white St Margaret's Gift Aid envelopes and mark "Harvest Appeal". These can be placed in the safe at the back of church during the week. To do this we need your involvement!
