Opening Hymn 372

Collect God, the giver of life, whose Holy Spirit wells up within your Church: by the Spirit's gifts equip us to live the gospel of Christ and make us eager to do your will, that we may share with the whole creation the joys of eternal life; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

First Reading *Hebrews 5. 1-10*

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you'; as he says also in another place, 'You are a priest for ever, according to the order of Melchizedek.' In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Gospel Reading *Mark 10. 35-45*

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.' When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. Organ Recital

Friday, November 5th at 12.30pm

The November Recital (may contain fireworks but only of a musical variety) is a programme of music by four English composers writing in the 1950s. Two are familiar figures who composed a great deal of beautiful and useful music for church choirs, namely Dr Harold Darke (famous for Darke in F) and Sir William Harris (Holy is the true light is to be sung at Evensong the Sunday before, October 31st). Darke's piece is called 'Retrospection', dedicated to the memory of Healey Willan, and doesn't seem to have been performed until the 80s. Harris's piece is called Fantasy Prelude which also seems not to have been published till 1983 (Harris's centenary). The other two composers are York Bowen, who was a major composer of piano music, concertos etc, who wrote his Fantasy in 1951 for the Festival of Britain; and Eric Templeton, famous for his Elizabethan Serenade for strings, and a conductor of orchestral 'light music'. His Short Prelude and exciting Paean are unusually invigorating for the period!

ST MARGARET'S EMERGENCY APPEAL

Headlines

- Total giving is down c £40,000 on a 'normal' year
- Hall and letting income is down c £30,000
- Our parish share this year is £105,000, but we forecast only being able to pay around £37,000
- The **good news** is that our costs are under very tight control - we have spent far less this year: (expenditure: £90,000) in comparison to 2019 (expenditure: £224,000).

Parish Share

This is the contribution that every parish makes to resource ministry across the Diocese. It pays for Fr Alex's ministry, the training of new priests, housing costs, support staff costs, and so on. We are one of the wealthier parishes in the country, so our share is relatively high - part of our contribution is not just paying for our own ministry costs here, but supporting ministry in tougher areas too.

The consequence of us not paying our share is that a church in vacancy will need to go without a priest for longer. This isn't just about spiritual ministry; many of the churches that our share support run foodbanks, credit unions, and all sorts of things that help people practically.

How you can help

Any gift you can make, large or small, would be very gratefully received. We have a number of exciting new initiatives in the pipeline for next year that will help us to raise our profile in the town and engage with businesses and individuals in meaningful ways. But for now, we just need to pay as much of our share as we possibly can.
