Collect Almighty God, who looked upon the lowliness of the Blessed Virgin Mary and chose her to be the mother of your only Son: grant that we who are redeemed by his blood may share with her in the glory of your eternal kingdom; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A note on receiving from the chalice

A reminder that we are not practising 'intinction' when receiving from the chalice (dipping the host in the consecrated wine). Primarily this is with hygiene in mind, as it risks passing germs from finger tips into the wine, but it's also out of consideration for those in the congregation who are gluten intolerant; in some cases just passing the smallest particles of gluten to the wine in this way could cause a very adverse reaction.

(And don't forget that at the Last Supper, Judas Iscariot was the only one to receive bread "dipped in the dish," and as soon as he did, "Satan entered into him!" Not quite the symbolism we're looking for... (John 13.21-27))
