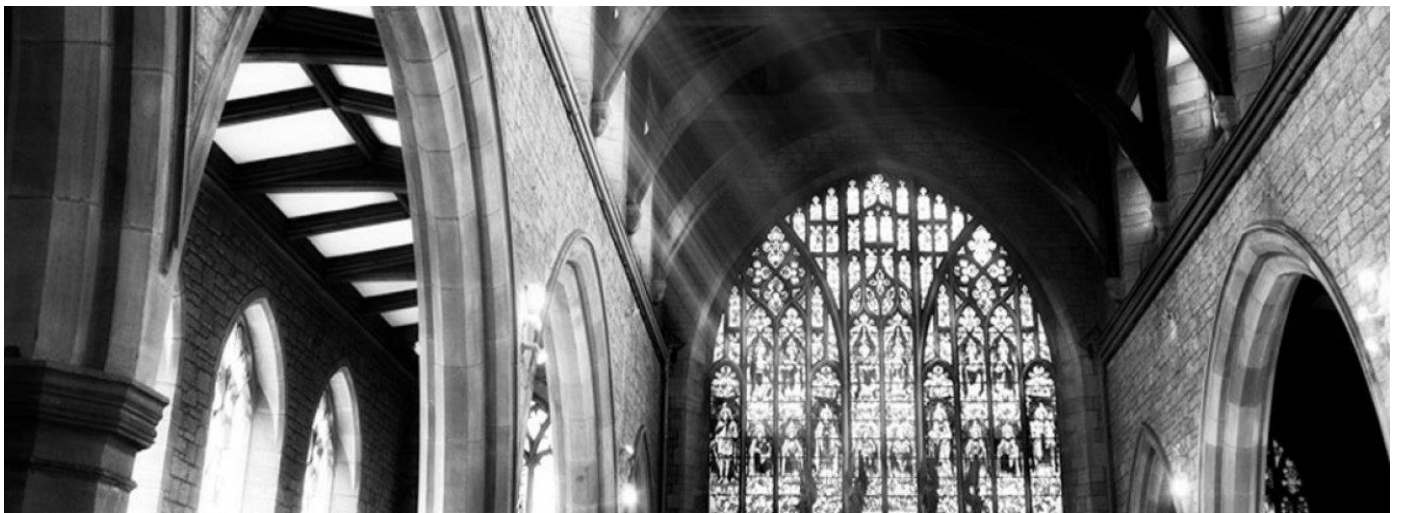

Opening Hymn

Collect Almighty God, you have knit together your elect in one communion and fellowship in the mystical body of your Son Christ our Lord: grant us grace so to follow your blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living that we may come to those inexpressible joys that you have prepared for those who truly love you; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

First Reading

Ephesians 1. 11 - 23

In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love towards all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets. But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.

But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. New Exhibition in the Parish Hall

An exhibition of watercolour paintings by Jonathan Cooke ACR takes place in the Parish Hall. Jonathan served a four-year apprenticeship at the York Glaziers' Trust where he learnt the traditional techniques and methods for the creation, conservation and restoration of stained glass, working on the restoration of York Minster following the fire of 1984. Most of Jonathan's work is ecclesiastical; he also works for the National Trust and other organisations in the heritage sector, and private commissions. His stained glass on a monumental scale can be seen locally at Cliffe Castle – the grand staircase window, and at the Soane Museum in London. His watercolour landscapes are products of his passion for the medium, and rare leisure time. He appreciates the opportunity to share them with you here and hope you enjoy them. Organ Recital

This is a bicentenary recital in honour of **César Franck**, the most important French composer of the 19th century (actually he was of Belgian birth, but spent his professional life in Paris). He was born in 1822, and died several months after a road accident which caused the illness from which he died, but not before completing his most important organ works, the Three Chorales of 1890. I shall play one work from each of the three sets of pieces: The Prelude, fugue and variation from the Six Pieces of 1862, the Fantasia in A minor from the Three Pieces of 1878, and the first of the Chorales of 1890.
