**Organ Recital: Friday 1 September, 12.30 pm**

The recital on Friday 1 September at 12.30 pm has two short items by Howells (Rhapsody no 1) and me (Paean op 26 of 1972). Most of the recital is taken up with the four movements of Rheinberger's Sonata no 20, the last to be completed in his series of sonatas in all the major and minor keys. Sadly, he did not live long enough to complete the set, but this final sonata of 1900 is as tuneful and harmonically and texturally rich as ever: a Rheinberger sonata is the organ equivalent of a Brahms symphony or a violin concerto by Bruch.
