Trees in the churchyard

The PCC is carrying out some work in the churchyard over the coming weeks. One of the very large conifers is touching the church building, and lifting up the path to the memorial garden, causing a trip hazard. We plan to remove this tree, and 'lift' the canopy of the remaining conifers to allow unimpeded access to the memorials. We also plan to remove the dead cherry trees currently standing in the shadow of the conifers along the fence. Permission has been granted by the Diocese and Bradford Council, and we expect this work to be carried out soon.

The PCC has commissioned a small working group to look at the churchyard and how we might improve it in various ways, alongside the new Eco group. If you would like to be involved, please let Anne Eaton know.

Advent Book Club

Please join us for a time of discussion and reflection on Advent themes on three Tuesdays in December, 6.30 pm to 7.30 pm in the meeting room.
