

Even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

Gospel Reading Mark 9. 2 – 9

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!' Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus. As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

<u>Stations of the Cross</u> <u>Fridays in Lent</u>

We join with our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters in this joint witness through Lent. When at St Margaret's, Stations will be at 2.30 pm; when at Sacred Heart, Stations will be at 6.30 pm (for locations each week, see the diary in the front of the Lent Booklet). On the last Friday before Holy Week (22 March) we will share the devotion at the Calvary at Middleton Lodge (if the weather is really bad, we'll meet at St Margaret's).

<u>Lent Group</u> Tuesdays in Lent, 6.30 pm

Our Lent Group begins next week (Tuesday 20 February) but we begin reading the book at home from this Wednesday, one 'character' a day. The 'Easter Book of Days' by Gregory K. Cameron is available online. Each Tuesday we will meet and discuss our reading so far. It will be much better to read the book, but if you want to just come to the group meetings, I will produce a sheet with a little synopsis of some key points. The Lent Group follows the Contemplative Mass at 6.00 pm.

Evensong Sermon Series

Join us at Evensong through Lent, when our preachers will reflect on 'art of the passion,' with a different painting each week.

Holy Week

We're very pleased that Fr Andrew Wagstaff will preach Holy Week for us this year. Fr Andrew has recently joined our congregation, having lately served at the Anglican church in Antwerp, Belgium. We have a number of services each day, and members of the congregation are strongly encouraged to attend as much as possible through the week – **and to make a supreme effort to attend the liturgies of Thursday, Friday and Saturday of Holy Week.** This is the most powerful and transformative week of the Christian year, and a commitment to entering as fully as possible into the principal liturgies will be richly rewarding.
