Letter from Fr Bernard

What a joy it is for us to welcome our Bishop Toby to officiate at our High Mass on Easter Sunday. He has been a great help to our hard working wardens and the PCC, so much so that he wrote in his letter last week that we should be able to advertise for a priest after Easter, with a view to holding interviews at the end of May! We are on course now - so continue to pray for the right priest for us.

Today we celebrate the Good News of the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead. For we who have heard and believe we have assurance of sins forgiven, and a place in heaven, Jesus said "I am going to heaven to prepare a place for you" (John 14 v 2). His victory makes this possible, so we sing "Now above the sky he's King"

However, the costly sacrifice of Jesus does not end there. There is a cross in God's heart that pains the three in one Godhead, until finally we have a new heaven and a new earth. Then there will be no more death or pain, for the old order will have passed away (Revelation 21 v1-8). In the meantime, God suffers with his creation for our misuse of its resources, and the appalling conditions in which so many people suffer and die. God is even there amongst it all, because God is love.

God is Love: and he enfoldeth
all the world in one embrace;
with unfailing grasp he holdeth
every child of every race.

Now it's the job of each one of us to spread the good news that through Jesus, we are forgiven our failings, and given the gift of eternal life. Allelujah, Christ is risen.

- 3 Parochial Church Council members



Churchwardens are elected annually and may stand for six consecutive periods of office. PCC members and Deanery Synod Representatives are elected for a period of three years.

I will post the names of people nominated. There will be a meeting held immediately before the elections on that day where you will have a chance to hear from the candidates.

Electoral Roll Revision
